

Vote By Mail Frequently Asked Questions

FAQ: Where is my vote-by-mail ballot? What do I do if I need help? You have choices!

📄 If you don't have your vote-by-mail ballot, but believe you should have received one automatically or misplaced the one you received, call the Middlesex County Clerk at 732-745-4202. If you cannot get through to that number, you can also call the Secretary of State's office (please let us know if you do that).

You may need to submit a replacement form, which can be printed, completed, and emailed back as a scan or photo. The form is here.

📄 If you need to apply for a vote-by-mail ballot.

- ➔ **Go in person:** After June 30, voters who need a mail ballot can go to the County Clerk's office, 75 Bayard Street and submit an application and obtain your ballot. You can apply in person and receive your ballot at the Clerk's office prior to 8 PM on July 7, Primary Day.
- ➔ **Can't go in person?** A volunteer messenger can deliver your application and obtain your ballot, and deliver it to you. Your messenger (or "bearer") can be a family member or someone else, as long as they are a registered voter in Middlesex County. (They cannot be a candidate on the ballot, though). If you need a messenger to get your application delivered to the Clerk and have your ballot brought to you, call us at (campaign number), and a qualified volunteer will help you **(Note: no individual can transport more than a total of three ballot requests per election cycle).**

If you wish to print the form at home to have someone in your family or neighborhood be a messenger you can find the forms here in multiple languages:

RETURN YOUR BALLOT TODAY:

- Your ballot can be returned by the US Postal Service, so long as it is postmarked by July 7.

- You can also take it to the lock box at the Municipal Complex (the box is located between the Municipal Building and the Police Department).
- You can also hand deliver it to the Board of Elections, 11 Kennedy Blvd., East Brunswick.

YOU CAN ALSO VOTE IN PERSON, for any reason including that you applied for a mail ballot and did not receive it or you cannot find the ballot or the application that you were mailed. You can vote in person at Piscataway High School or the Senior Center. If you are planning to vote in person, please know only provisional, paper ballots will be available unless you are a voter with a disability. Voters with disabilities will have access to ADA compliant voting machines.
